IRHA Supports HJR004 Constitutional Amendment in Nov. Election

The purpose of amending this section of the Constitution of the State of Idaho is to allow Idaho's public hospitals, which are primarily located in small towns and rural areas, to purchase equipment, facilities and technology to further meet the health care needs of patients in their communities. The amendment does not allow any tax payer dollars to be used for these investments.

Adopting the amendment will enable Idaho's public hospitals to resume the use of financing for equipment, facilities and technology to further meet the needs of patients in their communities so long as no tax payer dollars are used. This practice has existed in Idaho for over 30 years.
