IDAHO STATISTICS

Idaho covers 82,747 square miles, with a 2016 estimated population of 1,683,140 people – 556,682 living in rural areas. That's nearly 1 in 3.

The average per-capita income for Idahoans in 2015 was \$38,392, while rural per-capita income lagged at \$37,390. The poverty rate in rural Idaho is 16.5%, compared with 13.3% in urban areas of the state.

The state has 27 hospitals identified as Critical Access Hospitals, 47 Rural Health Clinics, and 14 Federally Qualified Health Centers providing services at 86 sites.

ADVOCACY. Influence public policy decisions that impact health in rural communities. Attend a legislative breakfast and read weekly legislative updates. Sign up to receive occasional call-to-action alerts.

COMMUNICATION. Receive timely updates on state and national rural health issues, including a quarterly Idaho Rural Health Association e-newsletter and National Rural Health Association news alerts.
